Habakuk 3:18, Yet I will rejoice in the LORD; I will take joy in the God of my salvation.

<u>John 15:11</u>, These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

Romans 15:13, May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.
